- We also offer the opportunity to retake GCSE Maths and/or English Language

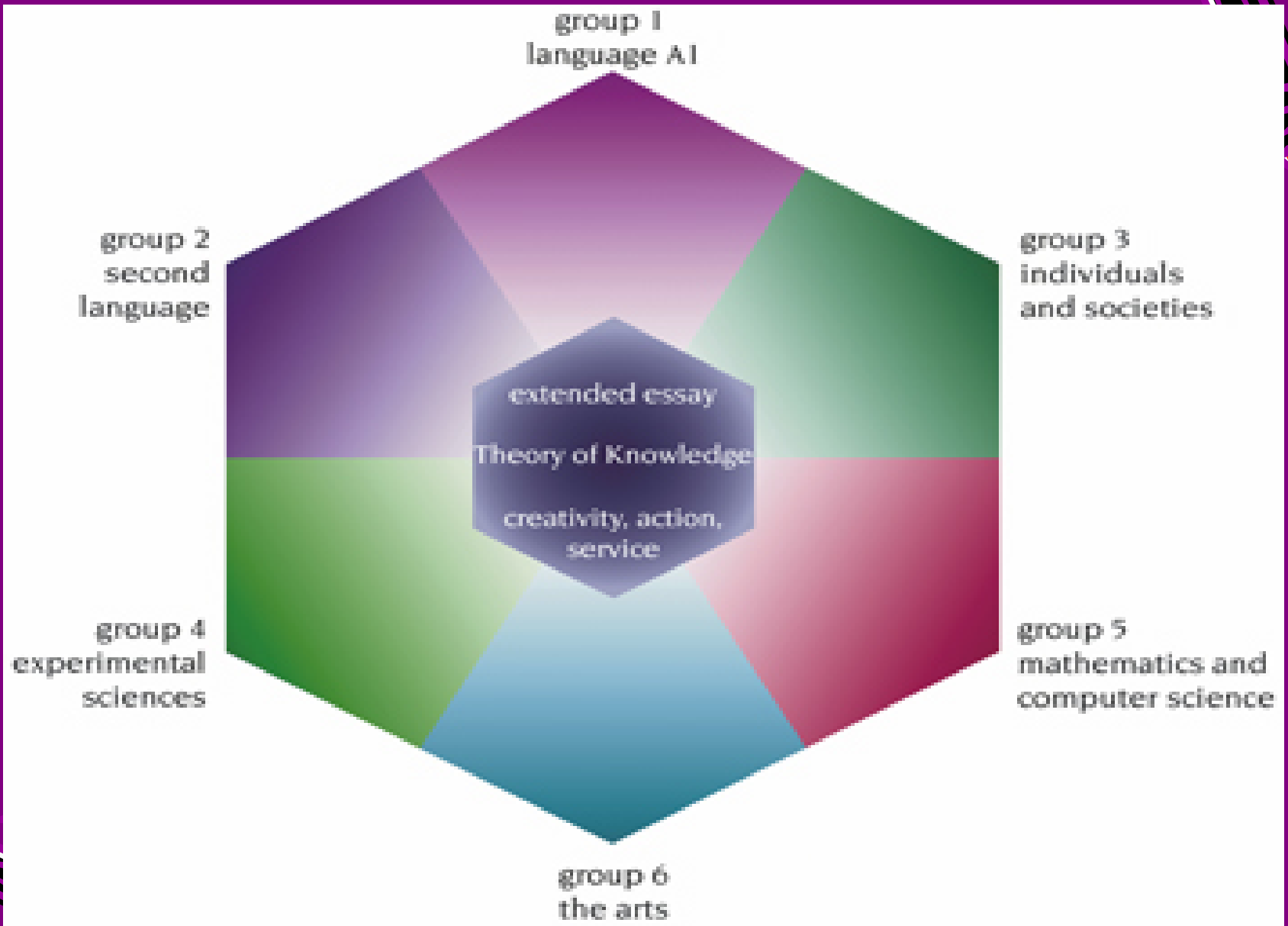


International Baccalaureate

What does the IB Diploma cover?

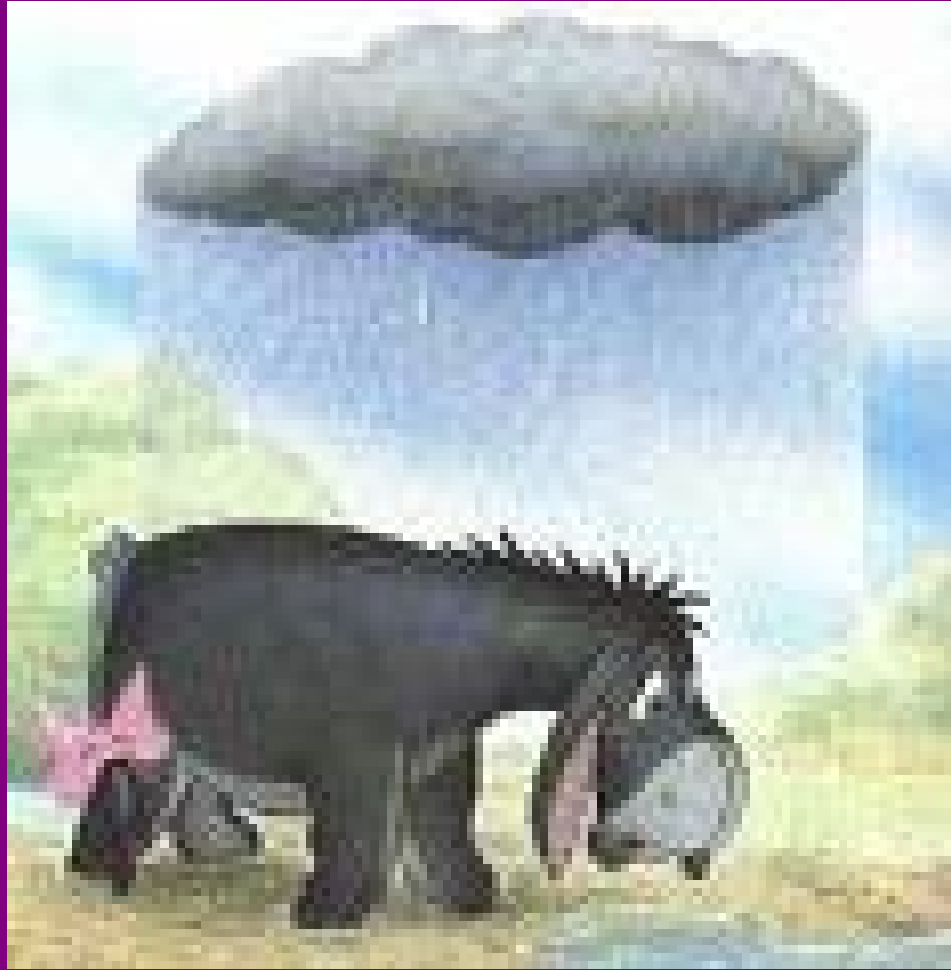
- Theory of Knowledge (TOK) - taught course, essay and class presentation
- Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) - arts, sports or expeditions, voluntary activities - 2 or 3 hours a week - log book.
- Extended Essay - any subject, 4,000 words and viva voce.
