- IB programmes promote the education of the whole person, emphasizing intellectual, personal emotional and social growth through all domains of knowledge.

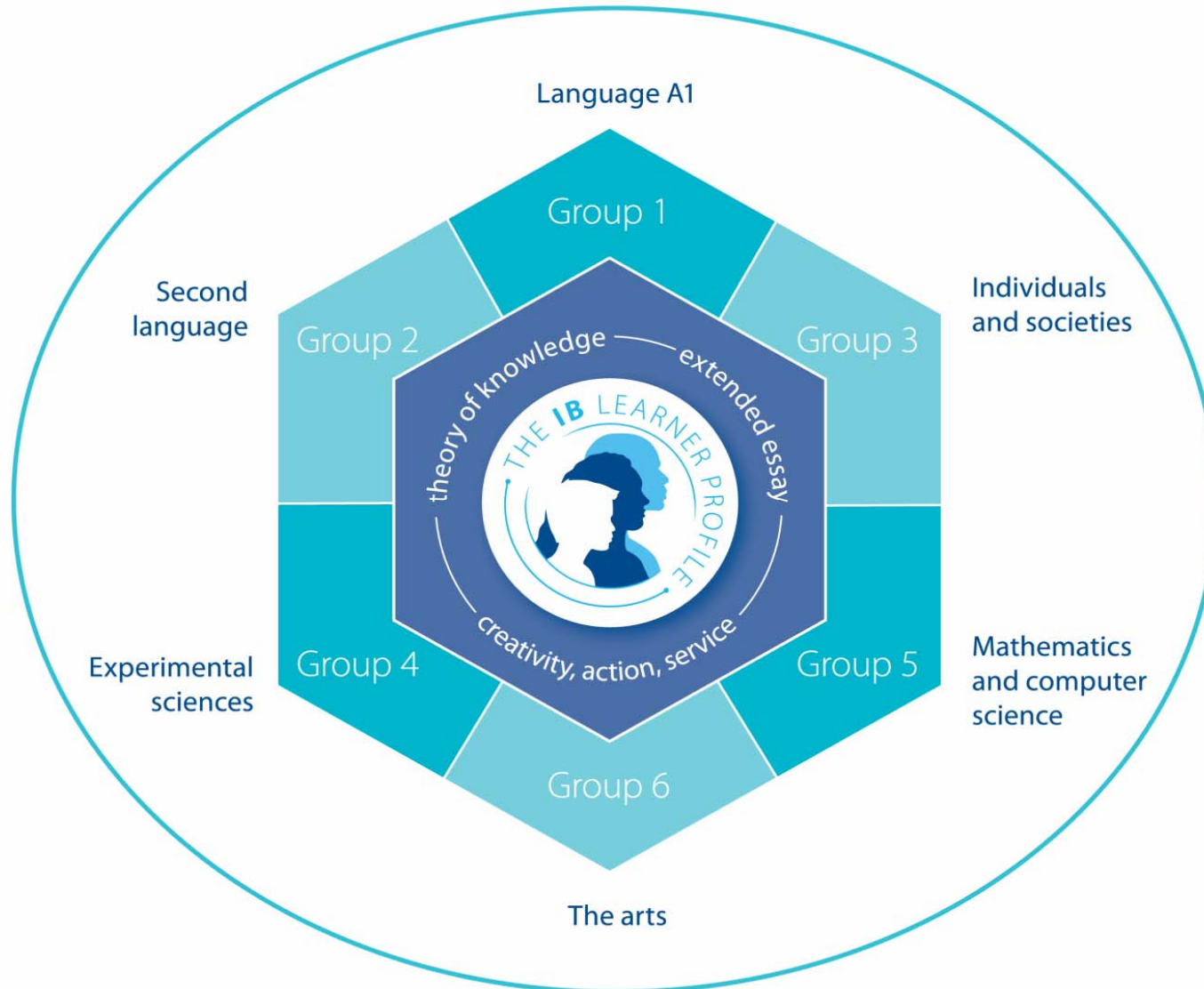

Contents: What does the Diploma Programme curriculum contain?



The curriculum contains six subject groups and a core of three parts.



Students study across the two years:

- three subjects at higher level (240 hours each).
- three subjects at standard level (150 hours each).
- all three parts of the core.

What does the Diploma cover?



- Extended Essay – any subject, 4,000 words and viva voce.
- Theory of Knowledge (TOK) – taught course, essay and class presentation
- Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) – arts, sports or expeditions, voluntary activities – 3 or 4 hours a week – log book.
